

## Graduate Studies

### Webster University

Webster University is a private, nonprofit, accredited university that offers undergraduate and graduate degree programs in many fields including business, management, information technology, psychology, communications, international relations, science, education, fine arts and liberal arts. Webster University enrolls approximately 20,000 students worldwide who represent over 100 nationalities.

Webster University is nationally recognized for its innovative resident and online programs and academic support for DOD and military students. Serving the military since 1974, Webster University offers program at 41 military installations and provides advising centers at many additional military installations. In addition, Webster University has over 30 cooperative degrees with DOD agencies that provide from transfer credit to appropriate masters degree programs.



### SSCF Required University Classes

While participating in the SSCF Program, fellows are required to participate in two online leadership classes through Webster University. Required classes, schedules and descriptions follow.

Required Course	2016-17 Schedule	Course Description
MNGT 5670 Managerial Leadership	13 Aug – 14 Oct	Organizational leadership is the process of influencing other people to achieve organizational goals. This leadership course focuses on leadership theories, provides practice in basic leadership skills and develops the student's self-knowledge of his or her preferred leadership styles.
MNGT 5870 Issues in Leadership: Developing Executive Leadership	18 Mar – 19 May	This course is designed to assist future leaders in developing effective leadership strategies. Major topics include the application of emotional intelligence, knowledge management and the need for building coalitions among team members to leverage collective wisdom. It will also prepare future leaders for becoming effective mentors and coaches.

SSCF colleagues at Huntsville will also be participating in the Webster University leadership classes, providing another opportunity for collaboration and networking among civilian fellows beyond APG.

### Optional Graduate Degree in Management and Leadership

Fellows may elect to participate, at their own expense, in a cooperative graduate degree program in Management and Leadership from Webster University while attending the SSCF. Fellows may transfer up to fifteen semester hours of acceptable graduate credit earned in the Senior Service College Fellowship program toward this degree. The Webster University courses and the SSCF credited courses are outlined below.

Fellows who elect this optional graduate degree will participate in additional Webster online classes scheduled as follows:

Fall 2	15 October – 16 December	2 classes
Spring 1	7 January – 10 March	2 classes
Spring 2	18 March – 19 May	1 class

Although, academic preparation days have been scheduled throughout the 10 months, completion of the master's degree will demand significant personal time in the evenings and weekends. However, the compressed 10 month schedule for completion of a master's degree offers a rare opportunity to complete a master's degree in a comparatively short amount of time.
