

CHARTER  
DEFENSE ACQUISITION UNIVERSITY BOARD OF VISITORS

1. Committee's Official Designation: The committee shall be known as the Defense Acquisition University Board of Visitors (hereafter referred to as "the Board").
2. Authority: The Secretary of Defense, under the provisions of the Federal Advisory Committee Act (FACA) of 1972 (5 U.S.C., Appendix, as amended) and 41 CFR § 102-3.50(d) (agency authority), established the Board.
3. Objectives and Scope of Activities: The Board shall provide advice and recommendations on the overall management and governance of the Defense Acquisition University, as set out in (4) below.
4. Description of Duties: The Board shall provide the Secretary of Defense, through the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics and the President of the Defense Acquisition University, independent advice and recommendations on organizational management, curricula, methods of instruction, facilities, and other matters of interest to the Defense Acquisition University.
5. Agency or Official to Whom the Committee Reports: The Board shall report to the Secretary of Defense, through the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics and the President of the Defense Acquisition University. The Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics or a designated representative may act upon the Board's advice and recommendations
6. Support: The Department of Defense (DoD), through the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics and the President of the Defense Acquisition University, shall provide support, as they deem necessary, for the performance of the Board's functions, and shall ensure compliance with the requirements of the FACA, the Government in the Sunshine Act of 1976 (5 U.S.C. § 552b) (hereafter referred to as the Government in the Sunshine Act), governing Federal statutes and regulations, and governing DoD policies/procedures.

Additional information and assistance, as required, and with DoD approval, may be obtained from other DoD Components with contracting authority and support contractors, including DoD Federally Funded Research and Development Centers, for studies and analysis support.

7. Estimated Annual Operating Costs and Staff Years: The estimated annual operating costs, to include travel and meeting and contract support, are approximately \$57,000.00 and 0.3 full-time equivalents.
8. Designated Federal Officer: The Designated Federal Officer, pursuant to DoD policy, shall be a full-time or permanent part-time DoD employee, and shall be appointed in accordance with governing DoD policies and procedures.

In addition, the Designated Federal Officer is required to be in attendance at all Board and subcommittee meetings for the entire duration of each and every meeting; however, in the absence of the Designated Federal Officer, a properly approved Alternate Designated Federal Officer shall attend the entire duration of the Board or subcommittee meeting.

The Designated Federal Officer, or the Alternate Designated Federal Officer, shall call all of the Board's and subcommittees' meetings; prepare and approve all meeting agendas; adjourn any meeting when the Designated Federal Officer, or the Alternate Designated Federal Officer, determines adjournment to be in the public interest or required by governing regulations or DoD policies/procedures; and chair meetings when directed to do so by the official to whom the Board reports.

9. Estimated Number and Frequency of Meetings: The Board shall meet at the call of the Board's Designated Federal Officer, in consultation with the President of the Defense Acquisition University and the Board's Chairperson. The estimated number of Board meetings is three per year.
10. Duration: The need for this advisory function is on a continuing basis; however, this Charter is subject to renewal every two years.
11. Termination: The Board shall terminate upon completion of its mission or two years from the date this charter is filed, whichever is sooner, unless the Secretary of Defense extends it.
12. Membership and Designation: The Board shall be composed of not more than 14 members, who are former senior Defense officials, or are eminent authorities in academia, business, and defense industry. Board members shall be appointed by the Secretary of Defense, and their appointments will be renewed on an annual basis. Board members, who are not full-time or permanent part-time Federal officers or employees, shall be appointed as experts and consultants under the authority of 5 U.S.C. § 3109, and serve as special government employees.

With the exception of travel and per diem for official Board related travel, Board members shall serve without compensation.

The Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics, shall select the Board's Chairperson from the total Board membership, and this individual shall serve at the discretion of the Secretary of Defense, through the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics.

In addition, the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics, may invite other distinguished Government officers to serve as non-voting observers of the Board, and appoint, pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 3109, non-voting consultants, with special expertise, to assist the Board on an ad hoc basis.

The Secretary of Defense may approve the appointment of Board members for one to four year terms of service; however, no member, unless authorized by the Secretary of Defense, may serve more than two consecutive terms of service. This same term of service limitation also applies to any DoD authorized subcommittees.

Each Board member is appointed to provide advice on behalf of the government on the basis of his or her best judgment without representing any particular point of view and in a manner that is free from conflict of interest.

13. Subcommittees: The Department, when necessary, and consistent with the Board's mission and DoD policies and procedures, may establish subcommittees deemed necessary to support the Board. Establishment of subcommittees will be based upon a written determination, to include terms of reference, by the Secretary of Defense, the Deputy Secretary of Defense, or the Board's sponsor.

Such subcommittees shall not work independently of the chartered Board, and shall report all their recommendations and advice to the Board for full deliberation and discussion. Subcommittees have no authority to make decisions on behalf of the chartered Board; nor can any subcommittee or its members update or report directly to the DoD or any Federal officers or employees.

All subcommittee members shall be appointed in the same manner as the Board members; that is, the Secretary of Defense shall appoint subcommittee members even if the member in question is already a Board member. Subcommittee members, with the approval of the Secretary of Defense, may serve a term of service on the subcommittee of one to four years.

Subcommittee members, if not full-time or part-time government employees, shall be appointed to serve as experts and consultants under the authority of 5 U.S.C. § 3109, and shall serve as special government employees, whose appointments must be renewed by the Secretary of Defense on an annual basis. With the exception of travel and per diem for official Board related travel, subcommittee members shall serve without compensation.

All subcommittees operate under the provisions of FACA, the Government in the Sunshine Act, governing Federal statutes and regulations, and governing DoD policies/procedures.

14. Recordkeeping: The records of the Board and its subcommittees shall be handled according to section 2, General Record Schedule 26, and appropriate Department of Defense policies and procedures. These records shall be available for public inspection and copying, subject to the Freedom of Information Act of 1966 (5 U.S.C. § 552).
