New Administrator for Federal Procurement Policy


On April 23, 2001, President George W. Bush nominated Angela B. Styles to be the Administrator for Federal Procurement Policy in the Office of Management and Budget (OMB). The United States Senate confirmed her nomination by unanimous vote on Thursday, May 24, 2001. Prior to confirmation, Styles was Counselor to the Director of OMB. Styles is an active member of the American Bar Association's Section of Public Contract Law where she recently served as Chair for the Legislative Coordinating Committee, and is a former Vice Chair of the Accounting, Cost and Pricing Committee.

She received a Bachelor of Arts degree, with distinction, from the University of Virginia, and graduated, with honors from the University of Texas School of Law, where she was an Articles Editor for *The American Journal of Criminal Law*, and was awarded the Order of the Coif distinction.

Before entering the practice of law, Styles worked in Washington, D.C. as a legislative aide for Congressman Joe Barton and former Governor Will P. Clements in the Texas Office of State-Federal Relations.
