The DAU Media Library is the primary repository and distribution system of media-on-demand productions presented by senior acquisition leaders, model practitioners, and DAU staff and faculty in multiple formats, designed to provide Defense Acquisition Workforce members with acquisition lessons learned and best practices culled from high-priority acquisition issues and initiatives. This system also houses a number of media objects (both audio and video) used in DAU's resident and nonresident courses as well as continuous learning modules. Archived webcasts and media-on-demands available through DAU's Multimedia Library or iTunesU supply workforce members with credible, proven practices and lessons learned anytime, anywhere.



The Defense Acquisition Guidebook (DAG) system focuses on DoD Directive 5000.1 and DoD Instruction 5000.02 mandatory policy, and recommended practices in the Guidebook's 11 chapters. It provides links to additional policy, law, and useful content housed in communities of practice. Users can navigate through the Guidebook via a document index, a graphical interface (Life Cycle Framework), or by topic.

The AT&L Integrated Life Cycle Chart (ILC) is a knowledge document gateway and serves as a pictorial roadmap of key activities in the systems acquisition process. Users navigate through a graphical model of the three major DoD acquisition process areas (JCIDS, Defense Acquisition, and PPB&E), isolate various areas of interest, and access more detailed subsections with related resources.
