Mr. Frank J. Anderson, Jr. is the President of the Defense Acquisition University (DAU) and the Director, Acquisition, Technology and Logistics (AT&L) Human Capital Initiatives within the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology and Logistics (USD[AT&L]). As DAU President, Mr. Anderson oversees all aspects of the corporate university responsible for the education and training of more than 133,000 members of the Defense Acquisition Workforce. As Director of AT&L Human Capital Initiatives, Mr. Anderson supports the USD(AT&L) in executing department-wide Defense Acquisition Workforce strategic planning, policy and program responsibilities.

In addition, Mr. Anderson currently serves on the Board of Directors for the National Contract Management Association and is a member of the *Chief Learning Officer* magazine editorial advisory board.

Prior to assuming his current position, Mr. Anderson served in a variety of positions in the U.S. Air Force, including Commandant of Defense Systems Management College, Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Air Force Contracting, and Air Force Competition Advocate General. He also served as a major weapons system program manager, product group manager, director of contracting for a major acquisition center, commander of a plant representative office, and warranted contracting officer. He retired from the Air Force as a brigadier general.

Mr. Anderson is a graduate of the Defense Systems Management College, Air Command Staff College, and the Industrial College of the Armed Forces; and he has a master's and bachelor's degree in business. He is Level III certified in Program Management and Contracting.

Mr. Anderson is the recipient of the Department of Defense Distinguished Civilian Service Award. He received the Distinguished Presidential Rank Award in 2007 and was selected as the Chief Learning Officer of the Year in 2004 by *Chief Learning Officer* magazine.
