

Ronald G. Joseph

Professor Ronald Joseph is currently a member of the Defense Acquisition University's (DAU) PMT-401 program management team. Professor Joseph comes to DAU after completing a distinguished 29-year career in the Air Force as a fighter pilot, experimental test pilot, and an ACAT 1 program manager. Colonel Joseph was commissioned in the Reserve Officer Training Corps at Howard University in 1980.



As an experimental test pilot, Colonel Joseph flew more than 50 different types of aircraft and accomplished several critical tests such as the development and integration of the targeting pod for the F-15E Eagle and integration of the Advanced Medium Range Air-to-Air Missile (AMRAAM) into the F-15C. He was then assigned to lead the Joint Target and Attack Surveillance System (JSTARS) deployment and advanced development team at Hanscom AFB, Mass., where he planned and executed JSTARS support for Operation JOINT ENDEAVOR. The organization was awarded the Department of Defense Joint Meritorious Unit Award in 1997.

As a program manager for the \$5 billion Joint Primary Aircraft Training System, Colonel Joseph, developed and to delivered 782 advanced training aircraft, 122 simulators, and more than 6,000 computers to six U.S. Navy and six Air Force bases. For this effort, the program was chosen by the Air Force Chief of Staff as "Best-in-Air Force" to represent the Air Force in the prestigious National Collier Trophy competition for the best contribution to the field of aviation. Colonel Joseph was then assigned as Commander, Training Aircraft Systems Group (TASG), WPAFB, OH where he was responsible for the acquisition of the Joint Primary Aircraft Training System (JPATS) for the U.S. Air Force and the U.S. Navy, the acquisition of the T-1A Jayhawk, the acquisition of replacement gliders for the USAF Academy, and support of all development programs for the T-38C Talon. Afterwards, Colonel Joseph became the Assistant Director for Operations for the Air Force Material Command (AFMC), Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio. As Assistant Director of Operations for AFMC, Colonel Joseph was responsible for developing policy, guidance, and directives for the \$1.4 billion AFMC test enterprise--supporting over 11,000+ people and an 18,000+ hours/year flying program. Colonel Joseph is a command pilot with more than 2,000 hours in 62 different aircraft types.




